

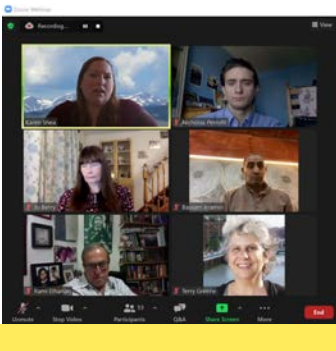
2020 YEAR IN REVIEW

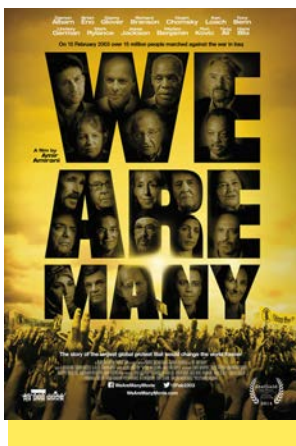

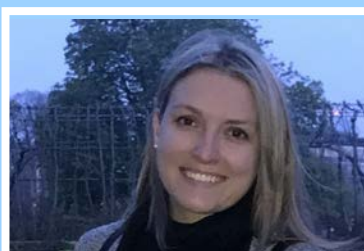

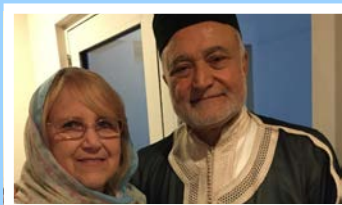

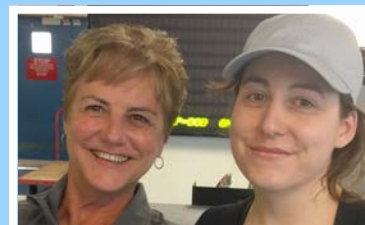
